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Principal's Message

Nice to catch up with you again in what has been a hectic start to the term.

Let me start with some positive news. Year 12 of 2020 have done it tough in so many ways, yet they continue to excel. The Year 12 Trial HSC exams have just finished and saving 1 individual it was 100% attendance. Even more impressive was the feedback that came from the exam supervisors, to comment on the fantastic politeness, and outstanding behaviour of these students. If you are the parent or carer of one of these students, please tell them how impressive they are (I did just that on our first whole school assembly today). Despite the interruptions of this year these students have been focused during their exams and for this they are to be congratulated. I think COVID will continue to impact on their experience of school during 2020. The latest directive from the Department of Education indicates that we are sadly probably not going to be able to hold our usual Year 12 Graduation ceremony at school. We will keep asking what we can deliver, but if nothing else we will ensure a ceremony is held (even though we can't have any visitors) and each student will have a great photo. In the meantime, please keep working with your child to reengage with their lessons now, as this is the time that vital feedback is being given by teachers in class. I will keep you posted about the Formal, as this is also unlikely at this point in time. I feel the sense of disappointment around all of these restrictions, but we will make the best of this. (I share with you my current disappointment as my son is getting married in 6 weeks time, after 12 years with his lovely fiancée, and his wedding has gone from 120 to 80 to now 40 if they are allowed to go ahead at all...) The most important factor is that we all stay safe and don't jeopardise the health of our families and ourselves. We can celebrate Year 12 2020 at another time, and it will be wonderful!!! Thank you for your understanding.

Something that also seems to have been effected by COVID is the lack of school uniform. New stock has arrived at the Uniform shop, but that doesn't really effect the number of students who are choosing not to wear the correct Uniform. I appreciate it is cold these days, but the number of students who own a school jumper, but are instead wearing a "Champion" or other brand jumper is really concerning. We all appreciate that Warilla High has a great reputation in the wider community, and part of this comes from students complying with the school uniform. I have had conversations with parents who have told me there is a certain pressure for students NOT to wear the correct jumper, from their peer group. Please take the time to explain to your child that wearing of the school uniform is not only a message to the wider community it is about us all being part of the same team. Wearing school uniform is also a safety issue, as we use this to identify if "outsiders" come into the school. Currently, the Student Representative Council, some staff and the uniform supplier have been holding meetings around updating the Uniform to be a comfortable and still stylish item to wear during their days at a school. In the meantime can I ask you to "dig out" the correct school jumper and have your student wear this.

Finally, we have had our canteen restored to being fully working and operational. While it was closed, we have had it painted and reworked so that it is a cleaner more functional space. My desire is to have a canteen that provides good, reasonably priced food as a service to our students, and it is currently working well.

Infectious Disease

I am writing to advise you that our school currently has a student who is receiving treatment for cancer. Currently, he/she is actively involved in the school community in between having treatment and dealing with and recovering from the side effects.

As this student has a compromised immune system (which makes him/her more vulnerable to disease), it is important that you do not send your child to school if he/she is unwell. For example, if your child has an infectious disease (such as measles, chickenpox, shingles or diagnosed flu), he/she should stay at home until no longer contagious. For more information about how long an illness is contagious, contact your GP or visit the NSW Health website at www.health.nsw.gov.au.

I would also appreciate it if you would notify me if your child has an infectious disease. This will allow me to assess the potential risk of the disease and if necessary, to notify the student's parents and medical team.

IMPORTANT MESSAGES

LATE ARRIVAL – CHANGE OF PROCEDURES



Attendance – changes to students returning to school after sick leave

With restrictions being tightened up in New South Wales, we have had a number of changes made to our school procedures. One of the significant changes is the way we deal with students who either present at school with flu-like symptoms or students with flu-like symptoms that are kept home by parents. If students present at school with flu-like symptoms, they will be sent home. Students in either of these situations are now required to take a test for the COVID-19 virus and MUST show a negative result to the school before the student is allowed back on site. This means that staff will be required to sight the results that you have received for the test before allowing the student to return to school. We understand that this may add complexities to some family situations, for example, being able to pick students up or accessing testing facilities, but these procedures have been put in place to ensure the safety of staff, students and members of our whole school community. Please be aware that this is now a requirement of all New South Wales schools. We would appreciate your full co-operation with these requirements and would advise you to contact the school if you have any further questions.


Science News

Hard to believe we are almost halfway through Term 3 which has started really well for our Science Faculty, with everyone being more settled after a disrupted Term 2. We are busy catching up on developing scientific skills in Year 7, with our students making canister rockets (photo below) which looks like a lot of fun.

Year 11 Biology are experimenting how enzymes work at different temperatures under the guidance of Ms Avnell, Mr Dyer and preservice teacher, Ms Boyce, whilst Year 10 have shown a lot of interest across our broad range of Year 11 Science courses on offer during the taster sessions.

Year 12 and Year 11 Students: just a reminder that tutoring for Chemistry will recommence on Wednesday afternoons from August 19 in the library and Biology tutoring is also available on Tuesday afternoons.

Just a reminder that students are required to bring equipment for class, with pens, a ruler, pencil, glue and a notebook considered essential items for science. In addition, many of our students are now bringing in their own laptops which allows us to explore more teaching and learning options in class.

Year 10 STEM

Mr Koglin's Year 10 STEM class are currently engaged in two parallel projects. The first, a computer science project with Professor Daniel Saffioti from the University of Western Sydney, where they are learning the fundamentals of how computers, networks and wireless transmission work, participating in a range of hands-on activities. The second, a 'Hot Wheels' challenge where students design and construct modifications for a Hot Wheels car to race against their classmates, where they will engage in feedback sessions with experts in Australian STEM fields and a former Engineering Student of the Year who works at the Australian Centre for Field Robotics.
