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Principal's Message

What a term, maybe I should be saying what a year!!! Well, we are on the back half of Term 4, and things are slowly returning to some form of normal, and I thank you for the great work you have done and are doing to work with us in these days of ever-changing craziness.

I must admit I was betting there would not be an HSC exam period, but I have been proven wrong, and our amazing Year 12 started their exams this week. I include at the end of my "message" some very heart-warming photos of our wonderful Year 12s. I congratulate them on their sensible and mature behaviour on their last day. It was a new tradition different to our assembly, "clapping" them out as they walked through the entire school, and classes lined the hallway walls "clapping" them to convey both their congratulations on their great work and best wishes for their future.

There are currently so many rules and regulations around the exams, but I will share with you the few that may impact on your student. In the unfortunate event that a student presents for the exams and then is positive for COVID we will be told by the Department of Health and given instructions as to how to proceed. To try and minimise impact, students are asked to

1/ Not present for an exam if they feel unwell, but rather go to get tested and tell them they are a HSC student, as this will fast track their results. A doctor's certificate will be needed so we can ask for Special Provisions for this exam. The school will help fill in the required paperwork to support your student. Mr Shaw and Miss Sheehan are currently working hard with Mr Kershaw and I to apply for "special considerations" for all of our students after their 15-week "lockdown", and we will keep fighting for them to have as many advantages as possible after their experience.

2/ Arrive in time for the exam and sign in as required. They need to wear a face mask during the exam, and air purifiers (15 in total) have been installed to ensure air quality is as pure and "virus-free" as possible.

3/ Leave the exam area at the end of the time. We are encouraging all students to stay for the full exam period, as sometimes students think of something extra to add after they have left, and every mark counts. The better all our Year 12 performs, the higher their marks are scaled up, so it is a team effort!!!

Year 12 worries aside, there are a few other things to update you on. Our wonderful Mr Kershaw has successfully applied for

a full-time Deputy Principal position at Bombaderry High School. He has worked at Warilla High for just on twelve years and made a significant impact on making our school the outstanding place that it is. So, it is with sadness that we farewell him and thank Mrs Dian Masters for stepping up to fulfil this position until the end of the year. During the lockdown, Mr Kershaw, Mr Hales and I became the Three Amigos, coming

to school every day to be there for your students and their needs. I acknowledge the fact that we were the only school to have such a heavy senior executive presence, but we wanted to be here for the needs of our students.

I know everything I write about seems to have a COVID overtone, maybe that is because these rules dictate what we can and can't do as a school, and the rules change nearly every day. At the moment, we are told not to mix our year groups (cohorts), so we have changed the timetable and times for breaks. So far, it is working, but we are not sorry to be enforcing the use of facial masks when students are not eating or exercising. I am sure you are aware of numerous local schools that have had to be closed because of COVID exposure. Any student who does not comply with wearing their mask in the hallways or classrooms will need to be collected by their carers. As an airborne virus, we are trying to keep our 1300 students, and in turn their families and the community, as safe as possible. I know we had various families during the lockdown who were diagnosed with COVID, and we, as a school, wish them well for their recovery.

A few of our traditional things have been managed, even if it is in a different form. Our new School Leaders have been elected, and we congratulate them on this recognition by their peers and the school staff. These students produced some amazing videos of them explaining who they are and what they stand for in terms of Warilla High. I was so impressed by all of our candidates and congratulate their families on raising such outstanding young people. Well done to Ryan Scheu, Claire Woolley, Seb Velasco and Brooke Wilkins as our 2021/2022 School Captains. Congratulations also to Adam Bosevski, Ebony Best and Jake Charlston for their new leadership positions

We are hoping, COVID rules allowing, to see these new leaders installed by the outgoing leadership team at the Year 12 Graduation. That brings me to another place where I am pushing the rule. We are anticipating that we will be holding a formal Year 12 Graduation ceremony on Friday 3 December, but more details as we are sure of what is allowed. Abiding by the current rules, we can have two adults per student attend this ceremony. They will need to be double vaccinated and be able to show this as they sign in to the ceremony. If there are extra adults who wish to attend, such as Grandparents, please contact me, and I will apply for the extra family members to be approved. Social distancing may still be required between family groups. Further to this, if you have another child in a different Year group who you wish to attend with your family, please let me know, and we will arrange this as well. I appreciate that ceremonies such as this are very important to families, and I will bend the rules to ensure you and your family have an enjoyable and safe experience.

Very recently, we have also been told that Year 12 will be able to have a Formal event. As this is held in the outside community, we need to abide by their rules, and this has also been explained to the students already. It is booked for 6:00 pm on Wednesday 8th December at Kiama Pavilions. As this is an outside venue, we will all need to obey the COVID rules they have in place from the Public Health Order. While all these rules are in place to try and make them as safe as possible, we are trying our best to give our beautiful Year 12 students an event they will enjoy.

Congratulations to all of our students, as they have mostly returned with a positive attitude and ready to work. We will be teaching right up until the end of the year to attempt to make up some of the ground that may have been lost while we were all in lockdown. Watch Facebook or your emails as the only real function we are looking at holding before the end of the year will be some form of Prizegiving, but given we can't mix our Year groups, we are yet to determine what it will look like.

Deputies' Report

How wonderful it has been to finally be back together with all of our students and teachers back into the classroom. It has mostly been a smooth transition from learning from home back into the school environment, and the students are to be congratulated for their patience, cooperation and versatility in dealing with the necessary changes to the school day, including their break-times and playground areas they are allowed to access in order to remain safe.

One of the highlights of the school day has been for the Deputies to meet and greet the students arriving each morning, with the offer of a face mask if needed and to praise their compliance with the wearing of masks for everyone's safety. It must also be noted that the student's compliance with the wearing of our school uniform has been excellent and is being worn with obvious pride - Well done, to everyone.

Most parents are aware of NAPLAN, which provides a snapshot of a student's performance in literacy and numeracy at specific points in their education journey. Schools, however, use a variety of other assessments throughout the years to gain information regarding student performance in aspects of literacy and numeracy. These allow strategies to be put in place to target areas of student weakness and build on student strengths.

One of these assessments is 'Check-in', which we used with our Stage 4 students on their return to face-to-face learning. This assessment focuses on the reading element of literacy as well as numeracy. It is pleasing to note that after the extended lockdown, our students have performed better than students at other secondary schools identified as being statistically similar to Warilla High School. This corresponds with our school data demonstrating that our Stage 4 students were, on the most part, highly engaged with online learning. It can therefore be inferred that this ongoing connection with their learning has seen them through lockdown in a good place to move forward into 2022 with a positive mindset and the skills to be successful.

As a final note in this report, both Mr Ind and Mr Hales, on behalf of the school community, would like to congratulate Mr Stephen Kershaw on his new position as Deputy Principal of Bomaderry High School. It has been a pleasure to work alongside Stephen, both as a colleague and a friend. He will be greatly missed.




